Abstract:	<p>The aim of this project is to develop the intellectual infrastructure for a more <i>Egalitarian and Socially Inclusive Europe (ESIE)</i> within University College Dublin (UCD). It will build on the work of the <i>Egalitarian World Initiative (EWI)</i> group that comprises a large inter-disciplinary and cross-university network of academics interested in developing a more ethically oriented perspective within their own core disciplines.</p> <p>The four-year Marie Curie project will build on the intellectual and organisational infrastructure offered by the EWI to enhance UCD's institutional capacity in egalitarian theory, practice and equality-sensitive research methodologies, and policy practices. It will do so by providing advanced theoretical and methodological training to the academic members of the EWI Network and its Research Clusters.</p> <p>The Marie Curie project will not only greatly enhance the capacities of the EWI Network and the whole concept of interdisciplinarity associated with it, but it will also have a profound effect on the life of the University, on Irish society and ultimately on Europe by providing a powerhouse for European thinking on equality in Ireland.</p> <p><i>The EWI is currently hosted by the Equality Studies Centre, UCD School of Social Justice (www.ucd.ie/esc/). The ESC has been an innovator in research and teaching across equality fields. The Centre and the EWI network will provide a supportive and exciting environment for visiting fellows.</i></p>
